## PRINCIPAL NEWS

This week I am pleased to share some wonderful results with you. This year, all staff have been working hard to develop calm and positive learning environments so that our students feel safe, confident and well supported whilst at school. Last week we received our Resilient Youth Survey data for 2023. This survey is completed by students in years 3-6 and our results demonstrate improvements in every outcome area for every year level. Some highlights include:

Areas that relate to the school environment

- Well above the national average in students reporting that they felt safe at school.
- A significant increase in students who reported that they had not been bullied at school or online (well above national average - some cohorts 100%)
- Significant increase in students reporting that they know they can find ways to solve a problem.

Areas that relate to the home environment:

- A significant increase (well above the national average) in students reporting they get at least 8 hours sleep per night. This corresponds with a decrease (well below the national average) in students reporting that they use a device between the hours of 10pm-6am.
- Well above the national average results when asked if they feel safe at home, and feel love and support from their family and have parents and carers who encourage them.

Future area of focus

For students who identified as male, results were lower than the national average when asked if they can talk about things that upset them. Providing all our students with the strategies and opportunities to discuss things that upset them will be a focus for staff moving forward. I thought it might also be useful for parents and carers to have at the front of their mind as we look for opportunities in our home routines to engage in open discussions with our children.

### **Mission Respect Parent Night**

It was lovely to have the opportunity to talk with so many parents as we discussed strategies to combat gender inequality, promote respectful relationships, and reduce violence against men and women whilst being led by the fabulous team from Mission Respect. On the night, parents were also given an overview of some of activities their children participated in whilst at school through the Respectful Relationships curriculum. Thank you to everyone who came on the night and to Dan Evans who organised the event.

### **Uniform Shop**

Last Friday was the final morning our onsite uniform shop was open. I would like to say a massive thank you to Linda Jackson for all the work she has done to ensure a smooth transition to the new model with PWS as our supplier.
