

Ganga will lead a school concert, beginning with a Welcome to Country, followed by interactive storytelling and then the main event – a musical and dance concert featuring the didgeridoo. The students, teachers and parent community will enjoy learning about Indigenous music, rhythm, and dance, while celebrating multi-cultural Australia in the now.

The concert will provide students with an insight into Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, which we hope will lay the foundations for future learning and understanding throughout the year.
